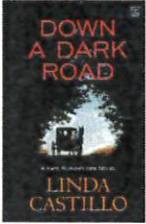

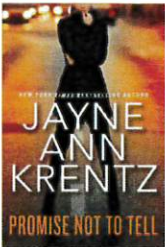


Down a dark road

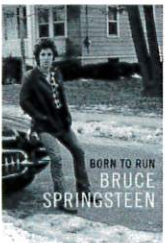


Promise not to tell

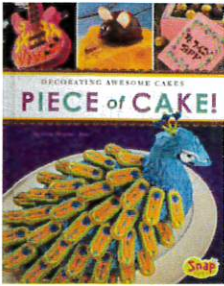


Born To Run

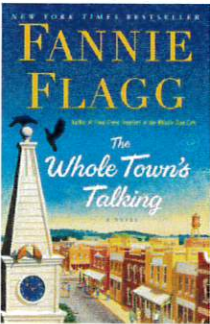

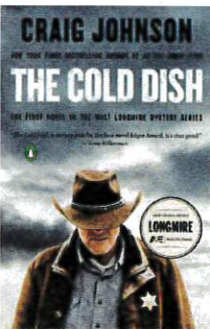

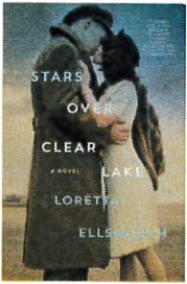


The Cold Dish

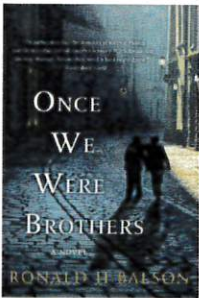


Stars over Clear Lake

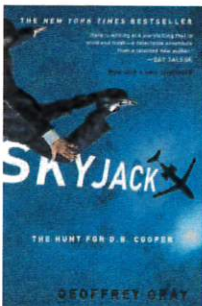
Once We Were Brothers

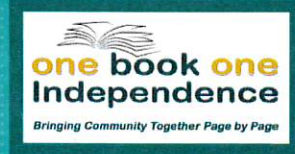


